My Dear Mr. Heath

I was surprised and delighted to receive your nice letter of Nov. 1<sup>st</sup> and am very sorry if has taken me so long to answer. I want to thank you very much for the pictures and other material about Langley Research Center especially the label pins which I am wearing on my belt coat. The pin has a double meaning to me - 1<sup>st</sup> as Langley Field was started in 1917 & I - I went from N.Y.C. to Newark N.J. to work for the Gov. on the construction of 150 Steel freight docks & stayed 5 years & he detailed each piece in the ship with holes for the nuts & had the various pieces fabricated in Ships east of Chicago & Milwaukee this took 18 months at Port Newark but only finished 50 ships when the war ended. I just celebrated my 98<sup>th</sup> Birthday with three parties on Dec 15-77. I did not know I had so many friends. I am legally blind and can't drive but I married again in 1972 after losing my 1<sup>st</sup> wife on Oct. 23 - 1969 after living a 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. She was from Pittsburgh. I am from Asheville, N.C. & a graduate of UNC State (Raleigh) in 1901 & am now its oldest graduate - I have a B.E + C.E. degree. I went to American Bridge Co. in Pittsburgh Pa. about 3 years & then to P.I.C. for 15 + years & came to Charlotte in 1922 as Ch. Engr. of a new Tech Co - Southern Engg. Co. We have 3 plants now. I retired March 1<sup>st</sup> 1953. after 52 years in steel work.

In 1929 I was asked by Edwin Jones of the T.A. Jones Const. Co. if we would make a design and price on the Full Scale Wind Tunnel at Langley Field. Being a small Co. & not knowing much about this kind of Bldg. I said leave us the sketches & I would think it over. I went to the airport and met a nice man in charge Messrs - REED - GILDED MILLER + DE FRANCE. I was there 2 days & they showed me a model in the yard & Pres. Hoover left them money & it was out of Politics. I came back & got in touch with Philip Cary about roofing & siding. So I told Edwin Jones. I would make the designs & price. Before taking bids I took my designs to & meant to show them what we were bidding on and if they could any critique. At the first letting the price was too high & Mr. Miller + De France ask me to resubmit over + I did. They ask me how could we lower the price. I said change the conduits of the large fans to the way they are now. So the 2nd letting Jones got the contract and we furnished the steel and did not have a misfit that I know of - we finished our work 1930 and I am glad to know it is still in use.

De France told me I took more interest in the Wind Tunnel than any bidder & I went back to see them 6 years later and I certainly would like to go now. I have no chance & I would like to meet you and those 30 Wind Tunnel employees who sent me a Christmas card. I do appreciate this attention.

I know you have the records & I repeated the Propeller Research Tunnel - furnished steel for NACA Tude - Steff Horst's effort Air Planes & the repair shop between W.W.II Propeller research. Every thing especially the delay. Sincerely Ben O'Neal
